Associate Degree Graduation Requirements

(1) Complete all department requirements with a "C" or better or "P" in each course (at least 20% of the department requirements must be completed through SBCC);

(2) Complete one of the following three General Education options: **OPTION 1:** SBCC General Education Requirements (<u>Areas A-D</u>) and Institutional Requirements (<u>Area E</u>) and Information Competency Requirement (<u>Area F</u>) OR **OPTION 2:** <u>IGETC Pattern</u> OR **OPTION 3:** <u>CSU GE Breadth Pattern</u>; (3) Complete a total of 60 degree-applicable units (SBCC courses numbered 100 and higher); (4) Maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or better in all units attempted at SBCC; (5) Maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or better in all college units attempted; and (6) Complete 15 units through SBCC.
