Certificate of Achievement Requirements

Students will receive an "Honors Certificate of Achievement: Social Sciences & Humanities" when they have successfully completed at least six Honors Program courses (16.5 units minimum) with a grade point average of 3.0 in Honors courses and no grade below a "B" in any honors course (a maximum of one honors course may be completed with a "C"). Students will receive a "Certificate of Achievement with Highest Honors" by meeting these requirements and maintaining a cumulative GPA of 3.5 or better for all course work completed at SBCC. Candidates for a Certificate of Achievement are expected to complete at least 20% of the department requirements through SBCC.
